Legislation

City of Omaha Elections

The City of Omaha holds a special primary and general election every four years to elect a mayor and all seven members of the city council. The elections are held the year following a Presidential Election. The primary election is held the first Tuesday in April. The general election is held the first Tuesday after the second Monday in May.

City of Omaha elections are officially nonpartisan. Political party information is not printed on the ballot. The two candidates receiving the most votes during the primary election will advance to the general election.

The 2025 Omaha general election will be held on Tuesday, May 13.

All seven City Council seats and the mayor are on the ballot.

The winner of each office in the general election will take office on the fourth Monday following the general election..

Important Dates

May 2 Deadline to register to vote at the Douglas County Election Office and deadline to request a mail-in ballot (by 6 p.m.)

May 6 Recommended last day to return mail-in ballot via mail

May 12 Last day to vote early at Douglas County Election Office (closes at 5 p.m.)

May 13 General Election Day (polls open 8 a.m. – 8 p.m)

Please read the bill as introduced. After you turn in your comment, you will receive an email to verify and complete the process.

House Republican Pushing for Tax Exemption for Military Bonuses to Be Included

in Trump Agenda Bill

Bonuses for enlisting and reenlisting in the military would be tax exempt under a bill introduced in the House on Tuesday.

The bill, from Rep. Brian Mast, R-Fla., would afford all service members the same tax benefits as troops deployed to combat zones, who don't have to pay taxes on bonuses or other income they receive while deployed.

"Military service members raise their right hands to defend our country and, in return, they deserve to keep every cent of the bonus they earn," Mast, an <u>Army</u> veteran who lost both of his legs while serving in Afghanistan, said in a statement. Recovery after a traumatic event is a process that takes time. If you take direct action to cope with your stress reactions it may create a sense of power. Learn how you can use active coping after trauma and for PTSD symptoms.

Active Coping

- Active coping means accepting the impact of trauma on your life and taking direct action to improve things.
- Active coping occurs even when there is no crisis. Active coping is a way of responding to everyday life. It is a skill that you can learn and develop.

Know That Recovery Is a Process

Following a traumatic event most people experience stress reactions. Understand that recovering from the trauma is a process and takes time. Knowing this will help you feel more in control. A few tips:

- Having an ongoing response to the trauma is normal.
- Recovery is an ongoing, daily process. It happens little by little. It is not a matter of being cured all of a sudden.
- Healing doesn't mean forgetting traumatic events. It doesn't mean you will have no pain or bad feelings when thinking about them.
- Healing may mean fewer symptoms and symptoms that bother you less.
- Healing means more confidence that you will be able to cope with your memories and symptoms. You will be better able to manage your feelings.


The Omaha National Cemetery Support Committee receives 20% of all sales. The committee is an all-volunteer non-profit 501(c)3 organization.

A County Veterans Service Office staff provides confidential counseling and assistance to Veterans and their families applying for Federal, State, and County Veterans programs and benefits. Federal Veterans Benefits include education, vocational rehabilitation, service-connected disability, non-service disability pension, healthcare, and burial benefits. Nebraska Veterans programs include a tuition waiver, admittance to a Nebraska Veteran's home, and emergency financial assistance from the Nebraska Veterans Aid Fund. Eligibility for State financial assistance requires Honorable or General (Under Honorable Conditions) discharge from active duty. This requirement is not met by active duty for training only. (Specific residency and service dates are required for some State Benefits)

On October 31, Governor Jim Pillen joined NDVA, military representatives, and leadership from the Army & Air Force Exchange Service in a ribbon-cutting ceremony for a new resource center for local service members, family members, and military veterans. The Nebraska Resource Center is the first of its kind in the nation, bringing a military, veteran, and dependent support center to a public-facing storefront within a military base exchange. NDVA developed the idea to support service members and families stationed at Offutt AFB and encourage them to stay in Nebraska when they discharge from the service.

The Nebraska Resource Center is located in the Offutt Air Force Base Exchange and offers a wide range of services to military members, veterans, and their families. It's staffed by an accredited veteran service officer from NDVA who can connect veterans with state and federal benefits and services, including reviewing service records, determining eligibility, assisting in the completion and submittal of forms, advising on appeals, and more.

We also have resources on employment opportunities and career advancement, details on occupational licensure and tax reforms in the state, options for transitional or permanent housing, ideas for recreational and leisure activities throughout Nebraska, opportunities for spouses and dependents, and much more.
